#### Fiscal Year 2012-2013 Funding

The Housing & Community Development (H&CD) Office Advisory Council met with applicants for the Fiscal Year 2012 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding. Several of the applicants were asked to make changes to their application and resubmit for an out of cycle grant. The Advisory Council have proposed five Public Service and five General Service Projects for Fiscal Year 2012-2013 funding.

The H&CD Office has written their Annual Action Plan for Fiscal Year 2012. The Action Plan was available for review and public comment from March 9 to April 9. There was a Public Hearing during City Council, April 9. The Action Plan was brought before the City Council Finance Committee on April 16 and the full City Council on April 23 where they approved the plan. The Action Plan has gone to the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) for their approval.

Three applications were received for an out of cycle grant request. The Advisory Council will review these applications and make a recommendation to the City Council.

The city of Cheyenne receives Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding from the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) on an annual basis. If you are a 501(c)3 and work with the city's low income population you may qualify for these funds. The yearly application cycle begins in October. There is occasionally funding available for general service out of cycle projects. Call **637-6255** to see if your project is eligible.



During the third quarter of 2011 the Housing & Community Development Office provided \$23,681.42 towards programs that assist low/moderate-income residents of the city of Cheyenne.

## **Accomplishments Last Quarter**

- Cheyenne Health & Wellness assisted one low income individual with Dental assistance.
- Cheyenne Transit has provided free bus tokens for 250 low-income residents of Cheyenne.
- **COMEA House** has started their Men's Shower/Dorm Expansion Project.
- Community Action of Laramie County assisted 4 individuals with emergency home repair.
- Habitat for Humanity ReStore has finished their work on the ReStore Annex. They opened their doors on April 10, 2012.

Also, it is not too early to start thinking about Fiscal Year 2013. The House Appropriators are preparing to mark up the FY 2013 Transportation-HUD spending bill during the week of June 4.
