About the Event:

Cyber Cheyenne 2023 was an initiative coordinated by the City of Cheyenne Technology Advisory Council, aimed at promoting awareness of cybersecurity risks within our burgeoning technology industry, local Cheyenne businesses, and government stakeholders. In recent years, cybersecurity threats have been steadily increasing in sophistication. The one-day summit was intended to address this rising threat intelligently at all levels.

Funding and Partnerships:

Hosted by the City of Cheyenne, the Laramie County Community College played a pivotal role as a premier sponsor, generously providing the venue. The Wyoming ISSA Chapter and the Northern Colorado ISSA Chapter also partnered with the city on the event. All other necessary funds were raised through sponsorships and ticket sales. The tickets for the full-day summit were priced affordably at \$35 to encourage widespread participation. Vendor-sponsored tables were made available for purchase, yet the conference maintained its educational integrity by steering away from a "vendor-driven" approach.

Marketing and Tickets:

Cybercheyenne.com was acquired with a temporary website created. The website had an average of 200 visits per month during May / June / July 2023. Promotion was done through free avenues of social media such as regular posts on LinkedIn, Instagram, and Facebook. The Wyoming ISSA and Northern Colorado ISSA Chapters promoted the conference to their cybersecurity industry members as well.
