Police Civil Service Commission members met at 10:00 a.m. in Room 104, Municipal Building, with the following members present: Don Pierson and Tom Roberts. Absent: Carla Winkler.

Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mr. Pierson, moved to approve the November 1, 2024 minutes as written. Mr. Pierson commented on the current Sergeant exam noting the Commission didn't receive a reminder of the testing dates and requested a reminder be provided to the Commission for future exams. Chief Francisco and Captain Janes gave an update on the Sergeant exam noting the process would conclude that day and there were 3 remaining candidates. Upon inquiry, Chief Francisco and Captain Janes provided information on the promotional testing process. Discussion continued on Lieutenant testing requirements with Chief Francisco noting there has been preliminary discussion regarding education requirements. He advised the issue with eligible candidates not wanting to test for Lieutenant seems to be centered around the inability to receive overtime pay as several Sergeants hold degrees. He added the Police Department has an education reimbursement program. Motion carried. Voting "yes" – all members present.
