Yard Waste Program Information

Yard waste containers are picked up once a week from the first full week of April through the week before Thanksgiving.

- Containers on street curb by 6 a.m. day of pickup
- Only lawn trimmings, weeds, leaves, pine needles, and pinecones inside container
- No bagged yard waste
- No branches, tumbleweeds, dirt, or rocks allowed

What happens at compost?

The Compost Facility was founded in 1999. In 2003 City Council passed an ordinance banning all yard waste from the Landfill. The City has dedicated resources to ensure that a growing City population can recycle yard waste and replenish lost soil nutrients through the Composting process.

Green waste, including grass clippings, leaves, mulch, and manure, can be turned into nutrient-rich soil conditioner through a natural process

composting. During this process green waste products are mixed in specific proportions with water and let rest in stockpiles (windrows) for a few months to allow microorganisms to break down organic matter, converting the mix into compost. The composting process typically reaches temperatures between 110°F to 160°F and is driven by microbial activity which accelerates organic matter

decomposition including unwanted weeds, seeds, and pathogens. As the green waste decomposes, it releases valuable nutrients like nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium into the compost which is used to enrich soil for promoting plants growth. This sustainable practice not only diverts organic waste from the landfills, but also contributes to healthier soil and more vibrant vegetation.

The Compost Facility is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday year round. May 1, 2024 through Sept. 30, 2024 we are open Sundays 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.
